## **Project Summary**

Through a 2013 CVNHP Implementation Grant, the CCHA created a one-of-a-kind touchscreen exhibit that serves to interpret the 45 year history of the Catholic Summer School of America on the shores of Lake Champlain. With the aid of local researchers and museum/library artifacts retrieved for the project, the CCHA was able to document this unique summer camp in a novel way. This exhibit has not only served to open up the Museum's collection, it is also used as a platform for new research to be displayed in an interactive and stimulating environment. This research has engaged university faculty and students, museum docents, board members, teachers and local collectors.
